Who else but Vans could so effortlessly marry SPD performance with skate-shoe styling? The company combined its classic "Off the Wall" gum-rubber tread with a comfortably stiff sole to create a shoe that performs regardless of whether you ever bolt on cleats. The Warners' uppers are made from synthetic leather, and a Velcro lace-protector covers the shoes' lightly padded tongues.

### RACE FACE DEUS CRANKS

The Deus cranks got a makeover this year, with completely redesigned chainrings and an updated bottom bracket, as well as a lifetime warranty on the crank arms. The bearings are pumped full of Phil Wood grease for longevity. The whole shebang weighs 859 grams.



### TRANSITION T-BAR30

No doubt about it, wide bars are sweet—and the 760-millimeter-wide T-Bar30 is one of the sweetest available. The bar has a 25-millimeter rise and a large cockpit area, allowing it to be cut (if desired) without sacrificing space for controls. And this year it drops 30 grams, bringing it down to the 292-gram mark.



### NITERIDER PRO 600 LED

NiteRider's new lamp overflows with cool features. Trickiest of all, it can be programmed with web-based software that allows users to choose from up to six different power-level or flash-pattern presets. The light runs for four hours at its maximum 600-lumen setting, and for a whopping 50 hours at its minimum 50-lumen output. The six-cell battery uses a dock-style mount, making for quick battery changes without fussing with wire routing.

### VHOLDR CONTOURHD

The ContourHD delivers high-definition video in a single, diminutive, self-contained unit. The camera features two recording modes: HD mode, which shoots 1280x720 resolution at 30 frames per second, or, for smoother, high-action video, the SD mode shoots 848x480 at 60 frames per second. One easy-to-use button controls all the functions, and the camera even has lasers that help orient the lens with the horizon.



### 2010 FOX RP23

Fox's ubiquitous RP23 rear air shock now comes with an internal boost valve, piling on features to its proven performance. The new tweaks give the shock a buttery smooth, nearly unnoticeable blowoff when Pro Pedal is engaged, while also delivering a more linear spring rate with less end-of-stroke ramp-up.
